Portland West RTC

John Bain- John Bain played professional soccer for 22 years in the English Premier League, NASL and MISL. He coached professionally for five years. John has coached youth soccer since the early 90's. His high school coaching highlights include two Washington State Championships at Mountain View High School in 1991 and 1992. John's youth coaching achievements include 16 OYSA state championships with five different teams. John is currently the Director of Soccer Operations for Westside Metros and President of the Oregon Premier League. He is also an ambassador for the Portland Timbers and was recently inducted into the Ring of Fame with the Portland Timbers.

While there, he started numerous programs, including a Youth Academy, a Skills Proficiency Badge, a College Advisory Program, and a Coaching Development Program, while also increasing the number of teams competing in the Midwest's toughest league, the Midwest Regional League, from one to six. Prior to his stint in Ann Arbor, John was the Assistant Men's Soccer Coach at the University of Vermont from 1999-2003, helping the Catamounts to two America East title games and a conference championship and NCAA Tournament appearance in 2000. He also served as the Assistant DOC for Nordic Spirit Soccer Club, leading the 86' Boys to three State Championships and the Region I tournament.

John is a 1994 graduate of Fordham University, and received his MA in History in 2003 from the University of Vermont. At Fordham, he was team captain and a member of the 1990 Patriot League Champions. He also played professionally for the Wilmington (NC) Hammerheads of the USISL.

Joe Beeler- Joe Beeler, who works in Eugene, comes to EMFC after spending 2005-2006 in Austin, Texas where he worked as a Volunteer Assistant Coach at Southwestern University, Goalkeeper Trainer for the Westlake Division of the Lonestar Soccer Club, and assistant to the New Mexico ODP 90 Boys team. In 1989 Joe began his coaching career in Southern California while attending school and playing for the California State University San Bernardino soccer program. While in Southern California, Joe was also the Volunteer Assistant Coach for California State University San Bernardino in charge of Goalkeepers for 2003-2004 and spent a spring season as the Volunteer Assistant for the University of Redlands prior to moving to Austin Texas in 2005.

With a strong background in Goalkeeping, Joe has had the privilege of working with many talented youth goalkeepers who have gone on to experience collegiate play at the NCAA DIV I,II, and III levels. (2) of the Goalkeepers have played professionally and others have played for ODP State, Regional and Youth National Teams. Joe is also a volunteer assistant coach for the University of Oregon Women's Soccer Team.

Kevin Primerano- Kevin Primerano comes to the Rogue Valley Soccer Club with a wealth of experience as both a soccer coach and administrator.

As the Manager of Academy and Player Development for the New York/New Jersey MetroStars (now Red Bull New York), Primerano directed the development and implementation of the MetroStars Player Development System which consist of youth camps and academies, competitive youth teams and reserve teams. Prior to his tenure with the MetroStars, Primerano served as the Head Coach of the Boy's Varsity Soccer team at Southern Columbia High School in Catawissa, PA. Taking over the program in just its third year as a varsity sport he led them to a 36-24-4 record over three years, as well as two Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association District Four semi final appearances. During this time, Primerano served as a Striker Director for Joe Machnik's Number One Soccer Camps, one of the premier soccer camps in the United States. Upon moving to the Rogue Valley, Primerano took the reigns of the Southern Oregon Fuego for three seasons. In addition to his role as the Director of Coaching for RVSC, Kevin also serves as a coach and evaluator for the Oregon Youth Soccer Association's Olympic Development Program and has recently joined the OYSA instructional staff. Primerano played collegiate soccer for Pennsylvania State University, Hazleton Campus. He holds an NSCAA Premier Diploma. He has a Bachelors degree in Mass Communication from Bloomsburg University.
