2025 STANDING RULES

The rules contained in the current edition of *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised* shall govern this meeting in all instances in which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the bylaws or policies of the association or state or federal law.

1. All members of the voting assembly shall present credentials and be properly registered prior to the scheduled start of meeting. Certification of the members of the voting assembly shall be completed before they may be seated and vote in the business session.
2. Members of the voting assembly and guests are requested to take their seats before the time the meeting is scheduled for the "called to order". Meeting is open to all interested in attending, but non-voting members and guests must be seated in the designated area. During the meeting, non-voting members and guests are requested to refrain from speaking except when entitled to the floor.
3. A voting member wishing the floor shall rise, address the Chair (presiding officer), be recognized by the Chair, and state the member's name and club affiliation prior to speaking on the matter at hand.
4. Debate shall be limited to one speech of not more than two (2) minutes for each member on each debatable question or article. Total debate for each question or article shall be limited to twelve (12) minutes. A motion to extend debate requires a two-thirds vote to pass.
5. Just prior to elections, the presiding officer will recognize candidates for statewide office and allow them three (3) minutes each for speaking to the assembly. A random draw just prior to elections will determine speaking order. The same time allotment will be made at the time of district director elections for candidates to speak to their district delegates. Following candidate speeches, a time period of up to fifteen (15) minutes will be allotted to assembly members to ask questions of the candidates. The candidate who spoke to the assembly first will respond to the first question. The same question will then be answered by the candidate who

spoke second, and so on until all candidates have responded to the first question. The candidate who addressed the assembly second will be first to respond to the next question, and in a like fashion, all candidates will answer the second question. If there is a third candidate, they will be first to address the third question. If there are only two candidates, then the first candidate will be the first to address the third question, and so on.

1. Voting cards will be used in the meeting as follows:
 - a. Voters will raise voting cards while remaining seated, which will be deemed to be a division of the assembly.
 - b. At the request of the Chair, voters will stand for verification of votes.
 - c. The Chair will direct any necessary change to this procedure, such as a counted rising vote.
2. When requested by the Chair, motions shall be presented in writing and signed by the maker.
3. The Chair shall have the privilege of rearranging the agenda and schedule for the most efficient use of time and resources.
4. All Bylaw, Policy and election results will become effective immediately following adjournment of this meeting.

QUORUM DETAILS PER OUR BYLAWS

BYLAW 501 – ANNUAL MEETING

Section 5:

A quorum of the AGM shall consist of one-fifth of the eligible voting members.

Section 6:

A quorum for the election of the District Director shall consist of one-fifth of the delegates from the member clubs in good standing from each district or two delegates from member clubs in good standing, whichever is greater.

BYLAW CHANGE PROPOSAL

1. CURRENT BYLAW

EXISTING BYLAW 404

Section 5.

Vacancies on the Board of Directors arising from the removal, resignation or departure of an incumbent shall require the President to appoint (subject to Board of Directors approval) an Officer, Director at Large, or District Director within 180 days of said vacancy.

(A) Within this period, once a candidate is named, the President and Board of Directors shall act on the candidate within 45 days.

(B) An appointed District Director must be either

- (1) a member of an OYSA member club in the OYSA district of appointment, or
- (2) reside in the district.

(3) In the absence of a nominee/candidate who resides in the district, the President may temporarily appoint someone from outside the district to serve until the next election, subject to concurrence of the appointment by the Board of Directors. This temporary appointment will end at the next AGM.

HOW THE BYLAW WOULD BE CHANGED

Section (B)(1) shall read: (additions in italics)

a member *or representative* of an OYSA member club in the OYSA district of appointment, or...

Section (B)(3) shall read: (removal of strike-through)

In the absence of a nominee/candidate who resides in the district, the President may temporarily appoint someone from outside the district to serve until the next election. ~~subject to concurrence of the appointment by the Board of Directors. This temporary appointment will end at the next AGM.~~

RATIONALE

The change to B1, allows clubs without members to provide prospective District Directors to serve on the OYSA board.

The change to B3, addresses that, historically, OYSA has had significant issues filling district director positions due to the restrictive geographical constraints on the position. Removing the constraints allows a temporary appointment regardless of the prospective director's location.

CURRENT APPROVAL STATUS:

The OYSA Board of Directors unanimously approved this change at the March 4th board meeting

TREASURER REPORT KRYSTAL PECK

I am pleased to start off with this report by acknowledging that the new staff members and operational procedures have had a significantly positive impact and fiscal responsibility has been a priority across the team. The fiscal year for OYSA is from July 1st through June 30th.

OYSA prepares a profit and loss statement, balance sheet and bank reconciliation each month. In addition, a monthly report is prepared for the Finance Committee, detailing budgetary variances. Finance Committee meets bi-monthly (and ad hoc, as needed) to, review financial records, approve the annual budget, approve ad hoc or material expenditures and assess fiduciary responsibility. Every third year the Association undergoes a full independent audit of its books. The other two years we have a formal review of our accounting practices.

In December 2024 the independent firm of Gary McGee & Co LLP completed a review and noted that the consolidated financial statements ending June 30, 2024 were presented fairly and no material adjustments or concerns were noted.

This past fiscal year, revenue growth outpaced expenses leaving OYSA in a stronger financial position than previous year. This is largely due to having adequate time to plan and stabilize the ODP program which was transitioned to OYSA in 23-24 fiscal year. OYSA will continue to invest in programs that will create a positive environment and enhanced experience for youth soccer across the state while continuing to keep the organization in a healthy financial position.

I want to extend my sincere gratitude to Roberta Cloutier for postponing her retirement to ramp in new members ensuring smooth transitions across the teams. OYSA staff are committed to implementing and executing best practices while being

responsible and careful with OYSA funds. They deserve our thanks and congratulations on a job well done during a time period of continued change.
