

## **SEPTEMBER 2025**

The follow is an accounting of the referee reports (in the grids) and abnormal situations at the bottom from the OYSA league in September 2025.

These are all games involving players U11-U14.

We have removed player names and references to clubs in this version.

Please note, some of the language used below may be offensive to some people. We have edited where necessary, but the words have been left in for context.

## **Referee Notes**

This player got 2nd yellow carded because he fell to the ground and the player took the ball from him, then he decided to trip the player (with the ball) on purpose while the player who got yellow carded was on the ground when the ball was nowhere around that area of the other player's foot.

Red card for # 23 of the home team, he crushed the keeper and with his shoulder he hit the keeper on purpose on his mouth .

2CT: The game was restarted with a direct free kick for away team.

Serious foul on a counterattack as the last defender, denying a goal scoring opportunity

Before the taking of the corner, kick home team Player 18 began to push away team #20 and the away player pushed back. I noticed the pushing and whistled for the players to stop. After this, both players began to fight one another with closed fists. I observed home Player #18 strike away Player #20 in the face multiple times. Once the players were separated, I showed the red card to Player #18 for violent conduct to. The player left the field of play.

Before the taking of the corner kick away team Player #20 began to push home team Player #18 and the home team player pushed back. I noticed the pushing and whistled for the players to stop. After this, both players began to fight one another with closed fists. I observed the away Player strike the home Player #18 in the face multiple times. Once the players were separated, I showed the red card to Player #20 of the away team. The player left the field of play.

In the 35th minute while a fight was being broken up between home team Player #18 and away team Player #20, Home team Player approached away Player #20 and struck him with a closed fist in the face. A red card was shown to home player #6. He left the field of play.

In the 35th Minute, after red cards were given to players for violent conduct, home team coach approached me appealing that a red card should be given to #16 of away team. I let him know that I was not going to as I did not observe him strike anyone as alleged. He then stated in Spanish, "Entonces eres un Pendejo arbitro, entonces. (then you are a dumbass referee then)" He said this in a loud and aggressive manner. He was given a Red Card for using offensive and abusive language towards me. He left the field of play when the Red was shown.

The player said this to me "Do you have fucking eyes, ref?" Immediately, I pulled out a straight red card with force.

The goalkeeper (#1) came out of the box so she can get to the ball first before the other player could on the other team and the player won the ball and the keeper tackled her down hard on a goal scoring opportunity.

In the 60th minute #1 for home team was shown a second caution/red card for delaying the restart of play after kicking the ball far away so the opposing team could not move forward.

In the 62nd minute, the head coach for the home team was shown a second caution subsequent red card for dissent. The official for the following match was in preparation for his game at midfield when the head coach for the home team began his vocal dissent of the center official once again. At this point I stopped play, gave the second caution/red card to the head coach for dissent. This began an abusive flurry of comments from this coach as he made his way across the field and exited the premises.

in the 64th minute, the GK for home team pushed over an opposing player who was shooting towards goal and missed with no other defending player behind to defend. the GK was sent off for DOGSO and we resumed with a PK for the other team. As the PK happened from the GK DOGSO, #2 just would not let it go with his disapproval. He continued post goal to tell the center official "that was such a bad call" and was shown a second yellow /red card for dissent. In the 16th minute, #51 of away team, committed a serious foul by tackling his opponent with exposed studs in the ankle, resulting in serious injury to his opponent. After a conversation with my Assistant Referee, and confirming they had also seen the serious foul, a Red card was shown to #51 for serious foul play. The play was started with a direct free kick. The striker from home team was running to get the ball and goalkeeper came out tackling him without getting any ball Wouldnâılt stop pulling opponents jerseys when they had the ball Coach said "you are useless referee". Yellow card. Player intentionally stopped a ball with his hand stopping a promising attack by the other team. This was players' second yellow resulting in an automatic red card. Through ball given to home team player on a breakaway and the last defender, #25 tripped him from behind just outside the box. He got a yellow for kicking the ball after a foul and later he missed the ball when defending and come from behind a slide tackle and didnâ? t even touch the ball with full control over his body and his actions. He was down 2 points and so he subbed in a players older brother who wasnt on the roster and he had pulled from the spectators

Red card to a Assistant coach of the away team. I give to him a yellow card for arguing every call I made after (six consecutive calls including across from the field) after which he responded to me I don't care that you give me yellow card [I'll keep doing it] while laughing so I have him a straight red card for using offensive, insulting/ abusive language and actions. After receiving the red card the coach was initially confused by the red card and initially did not want to leave but finally obliged while yelling he would report me and took pictures of me on his phone while slowly leaving the field.

In the 46th minute, a player from the home team was in possession of the ball in the visiting team's penalty area. He was advancing on goal in a one-on-one situation with the goalkeeper. The second-to-last defender, committed a holding foul on the attacker in possession by grabbing his shoulder and pulling/pushing him to the ground. As all of the criteria for DOGSO were satisfied (distance from goal, number of defenders, direction of play, and likelihood of keeping/gaining possession), play was stopped for the foul and the player was sent off for denying an obvious goal-scoring opportunity. The player left the field and returned to his bench without incident, and play was restarted with a penalty kick for the home team.

Home Team player no 13 was sent off after receiving a 2nd yellow card at 60th minute of the play for serious tackle on the player.

Pushed opponent from behind resulted in 2nd yellow=red.

Player did a careless foul and pushed player to the floor with no ball which was another yellow which resulted in a red.

I sent Off the AC for by showing the red card, after the second caution.

I try to have a dialogue with player to encourage him to keep his cool. He proceeds to turn around and walk away as lâ?? Im talking to him, I blow the whistle and ask him to return to me. He turn around, faces me as says â?? Me vale madres lo que me digasâ? and does a â?? go awayâ? hand gesture.

I don't give a damn what you tell me.

As stated in regard to the first yellow card, early in the game (at approximately the 10 minute mark), the coach complained about a call I had made at the other end of the field on one of his players. He insisted that there was no foul and that I needed to "talk to him" at which point I went over, explained what I called and gave him a warning, letting him know that arguing from the bench would not be tolerated any further. In the 74th minute of the game an attacking player from the away team was driving the ball on the team side of the filed toward the opponent's goal. Approximately two yards outside the 18 yard box a defender challenged the attacker and made a successful slide tackle, dispossessing the attacking player. The attacking player went to ground and neither I or the AR1 called a foul as it was deemed to be a clean tackle. Coach immediately began complaining about the call and that it was "absolutely a foul." I told him that the tackle was clean, the defender contacted the ball first and that there was no foul. The AR1 and I both saw clean ball contact, no careless tackle and no unsporting conduct. Coach continued to argue the point, expanding his comments to the "terrible officiating" all game. At that point I issued him a yellow card for dissent. I was going to turn back to restart play, however, the coach did not return to the bench and kept talking, yelling at me about the "terrible reffing all game," that "I have no idea what I am even calling," and asking if it "made me feel better" to give him the yellow card. At that point I determined that this was clearly additional dissent and unsporting conduct and issued a second yellow card, and therefore a red card was shown. The coach slowly packed up and left the bench area while continuing to hurl insults at me from the team area. Once he had left the team area, I restarted play. Shortly thereafter, I noticed that he failed to leave the stadium and was just standing on the other side of the field and at that point I stopped play again and told him he needed to leave the stadium. He slowly walked up the stairs and out of view. At that point I resumed the game. I think it is important to note that immediately after the final whistle, while teams were still on the field and referees present, he returned to the stadium and back onto the field to join his team. I made a point to quickly leave the area with the AR1, who is a new official and just a freshman in high school while the AR2 went directly to her parents.

First card was given to the away coach in the 60' minute for arguing about a penalty decision against his team that happened earlier in the game after given multiple warnings for dissent. At the 67' minute, Right after giving a yellow to #14, he complained about that his players couldn't be physical, and kept repeating it after I explained what the yellow was for. A second yellow was shown and he continued protesting until going to the parking lot.

He throw a punch on number 5 and they got into a fight

He throw a elbow then got into a fight with number 26

In the 19th minute the home team had a shot come in to the box that took a high bounce toward the far post. #24 of the away team was on the far post and stuck his arm out to block the ball from going in the goal. The ball bounced off his arm and went out of bounds instead of in to the net. He was shown a red card for denying the opposing team a goal or an obvious goal-scoring opportunity by committing a deliberate handball offence. He was removed from the game and the home team was awarded a penalty kick.

A red card was shown after receiving 2 yellow cards. Coach left the field and the club director took coaching responsibilities.

At the 24th minute, the Home team attacker broke free toward goal with no defenders close or between him and the net. The Away goalkeeper (GK #32) rushed out of the penalty area at high pace to the 20â225 yard line, where the attacker struck the ball toward the open goal. The GK raised his arm to block the ball, denying an obvious goal-scoring opportunity. Immediately afterward he collided with the attacker. I stopped play and showed a red card to the GK for DOGSO by handball. After this I still confirmed the incident with AR2, who agreed that there had been a touch by the hand. I had a courteous chat with the coach. The goalkeeper left the field without incident, but did throw his jersey/item in anger when he got to the bench (I did not think this was dissent, but just frustration).

Unsporting Behavior: Away team player was close to his teammate (#11) who was dribbling the ball against a player from the opposition (at the start of the attacking third). His teammate went past the opponent and he shouted (with his face close to the opponent "yes, do it again"). He also smacked his hands together toward and very close to the the opponent player. I shouted for him to stop taunting -- but he continued and did the same again provocatively clapping his hands at the player and shouting. I stopped play and asked the player to come with me toward his bench. As we advanced toward the bench he loudly said to his coach and bench that he was just feeling happy and saying happy things. Coach started to defend the player toward me. I asked coach for a moment to explain what I saw, what I did and what his player did. Coach spoke over me and spoke to his bench about me while I was trying to explain what happened. I gave the player his second YC for UB, taunting and then the RC for his second YC. Coach protested saying why card him for cursing or taunting. He said they are only kids and that I was not letting them play. I thanked coach and turned back to the restart which was an indirect free kick for home team.

Home team player was the last defender who got passed by the attacker and tackled the attacker from behind, denying an obvious scoring chance.

On a disputed ball in the middle of the field that ended in a throw in for the home team, subject player said to the referee "Cuanto le pagaron (how much did they pay you". Player was shown a RC for (Insulting language). Play was re-started with throw in for the home team at the sideline where the ball went out.

The match was competitive, highly physical, and both teams were strongly motivated to win. Players frequently engaged in physical challenges throughout the game.

In the 42 minute of the match, after a foul was committed by a home team player from behind on an opposing player who was dribbling forward, both players engaged in unsporting behavior. They began pushing and throwing elbows at each other. I immediately intervened, and with the assistance of the home coach, the situation was brought under control.

Both players were shown red cards for violent conduct.

It should also be noted that the coaches of both teams and the parents in attendance remained respectful and appropriate at all times. No aggression was observed from either the benches or the spectators.

The match was competitive, highly physical, and both teams were strongly motivated to win. Players frequently engaged in physical challenges throughout the game.

In the 42 minute of the match, after a foul was committed by a home team player from behind on an opposing player who was dribbling forward, both players engaged in unsporting behavior. ## **Abnormal Situations**

- A couple of the away team players claimed they heard a home team player use bad language.
- Late in the game, The home team was leading 1-0.

With 2 minutes left, home team committed a foul (tripping) just inside the edge of their penalty box. I awarded a penalty kick for the away team. The AR took her place along the end line. Just after I blew the whistle and before the kick, I noted that the GK was stationary and both feet were positioned approximately 6" in front of the faint yellow end line. The kick was taken and the GK blocked the kick.

I did not immediately award a goal, but ran over to the AR and asked her what she saw. She specifically stated that the GK had both feet in front of the line the whole time. I waved off the goal and informed the players that we would re-take the kick. The home team bench was immediately agitated and demanded an explanation. I approached about half the way to the bench and explained that the GK was not on the line and the kick would be retaken. Home Team Coach argued that was the wrong call and that we just had it out for them. He yelled "I wanna talk to you after the game!".

The kick was retaken, and was successful. This leveled the score at 1-1. Shortly after the restart, the away team scored again, taking a 2-1 lead. The game ended shortly thereafter as 2-1 at 60+1m. Immediately after the final whistle, home team coaches came onto the field to challenge my call. Coach demanded to know if the GK foul was my call, or my AR made the call. In the interest of protecting my AR, I told him "It doesn't matter. It's my call." He again pressed, and I told him "We both agreed on that call, and it is mine as the center to make." He continued to press, even claiming that I was supposed to issue a warning to the GK before the attempt if they were not on the line. I observed him visibly angry and the home team assistant Coach trying to hold him back. At this point, my female AR was next to me so I prioritized getting us off the field. I ignored further discussions about this topic and made our way to the referee area at center field.

The coaches returned to their bench. From there I could hear the home team coaches loudly telling the players that the referees are horrible and cannot admit to their mistakes. The club coaches had more comments loudly to their players demeaning the referees, but no cursing was heard. They continued to complain that "the ref had it out for them". Club director told me that I am on bad terms with all the home team parents. I asked him "What about the penalty retake was an incorrect call?" and he had no answer, but continued complaining about games in the past seasons. Â I told him that if he had any criticism for my work from this game, I would recommend contacting the referee assignor. I debating issuing red cards after the game, but felt that leaving the area was best rather than inflaming the situation. I left the field with the AR, who reported to me that she never wanted to do these games again. On the way out, multiple home team parents could be heard with demeaning comments towards the referees.Â

- 30 minute delay due to thunder storm at half time. Game was resumed and finished.
- Teams are listed as U12. Coaches and officials agreed to play with U11 heading rules since both teams are 2015 teams.
- Great first games ever for ARs. They did really well.
- put wrong score in.
- Ended 2 minutes early due to thunder and an agreement between both coaches to end early.
- Yellow card for # 52 of the away team, at minute 33 on 2nd half he yelled on me when I called him a foulâ?;
- Red card for #23 of the home team, he crushed the keeper and with his shoulder he hit the keeper on purpose on his mouth.
- The home team game balls were too old.
- There Uniforms were all kind of mixed.
- They had to borrow jerseys from the opposite team.
- I had one team add another player and the other team switched up the line up.
  - The center referee issued a yellow card to #28 for grabbing an opposing player's arm in the 20th minute.
- Away team head coach carded for dissent in the 35th minute after receiving a warning early
  in the game to stop. In the 38th minute following a foul call I noticed the coaches of both
  having a heated discussion between them. With the home team coach walking towards the
  away bench. I stopped the restart of play and observed the interaction. The coaches quickly
  ended their discussion and play resumed without major incident.
- At halftime the JV feilds sprinklers started to go off so we switched over to the Varsity feild.
   AR1 and AR2 switched at halftime because of the feild switch so we wouldn't have the same defensive team as the first half. And the Center gave a yellow card to player 55 on the home team I do not know the nature of the foul that caused the card to be issued.
- Yellow issued to number 56 on away team for fragrant foul.
- The game ended early after I noticed lightning, at first I thought I was seeing things until I comfired it then I told the Center and then the game ended at the last 10 mins.

- The parents were all yelling at the refs, including me, saying bad words and not stopping after getting warnings
- Parents were saying rude things to referees including me. Would not stop after warnings
- In the 20/25 minute mark of the second half, my AR 2 let me know that a parent was harassing the refereeing team, and right after that same parent started yelling bad words after an offside call that he didn't like. I stopped the game to speak to the visiting team's coach to let him know about the situation and that the parent would be removed from the field of play. The coach went to talk to him, he left, and the game continued normally! At minute 35 of the second half there was a penalty against the visiting team, which I told the person who would take the penalty that after the penalty the game would be over and so it happened, the game ended and the visiting goalie made a bad comment and my AR1 explained to him that even though the game ended he could get a red card but it was only a warning, then the goalieal approached me to complain because his son got a red card and we made him cry (because he was crying in excitement) and I only explained to the father what his son said and what AR1 explained to him, I only addressed the coach so as not to escalate the situation, but honestly these parents are very harassing!! After trying to calm the situation, after several minutes, a player from the visiting team tells me that number 13 player called him Slurt!! which my AR's and I didn't hear anything during the game, it was just trying to compense their bad behavior!!

Referee had to pause the game to get the visiting coach to address his parents. One parent was asked to leave. After the game I had to use the restroom but when I returned to our gear there was a group of parents encircling the referee and AR1. The visiting coach again had to wrangle his parents and remove them from the area. As I understand both the coach and team manager apologized to the referee.

After the final whistle the visiting (winning) teamâ? goal keeper loudly exclaimed â? thatâ? fucking bullshit! â? I wanted him that I heard him and in the future that could still result in a card even though the game was over. â??

During the game pause the home head coach had a conversation with both his field players and bench players reminding them that poor behavior would not be tolerated. He should be commended for keeping his kids in a positive mind set and directing them to abide by the rules.

- the home team presented unlaminated paper sheets with player cards printed on them for check in. After a call from the referee assignor and gameday hotline, we were advised to allow the match to be played. One coach and one player were printed on the roster but were not included on the printed player card sheets. The coach watched the match from the spectator side and the player sat on the bench and did not participate in the game.
- the game was deleted because a thunder lightning. The game started past four. And finished with not any problem anymore.

- Their was a bunch of thunder and lighting so both teams decided to cancel the game since they could scrimmage each other and they didnâ? It know when the storm would end.
- Al finalizar el encuentro, mientras los equipos se retiraban del terreno de juego, una aficionada del equipo local profiriÃ<sup>3</sup> insultos y amenazas verbales dirigidas al director técnico del equipo visitante.

Si bien dichas expresiones no fueron escuchadas directamente por mi persona, el árbitro asistente número 1 (LÃ-nea 1) me informó y confirmó haber presenciado y escuchado los hechos.

Se identificó a la persona como una aficionado ubicada en la zona próxima al banco del equipo visitante. Se solicita a la autoridad competente tomar las medidas correspondientes.

At the end of the match, as the teams were leaving the field of play, a female fan of the home team hurled insults and verbal threats at the visiting team's manager.

Although I did not directly hear these remarks, Assistant Referee 1 (Line 1) informed me and confirmed having witnessed and heard the events.

The person was identified as a fan located in the area near the visiting team's bench. The competent authority is requested to take the appropriate measures.

- Thunder and lightning were observed just before kick off. Game was delayed approximately by 45 minutes. CR called the OYSA hotline immediately after suspending the game and before re-starting the game.
- Game canceled due to smoke
- Both set of Fans got into a physical altercation. #20 of the away team got into an altercation with home team #6 and #18 and received red flags. The HC of the home team received a red card.

After the match concluded, I noticed a home team parent pursuing an away team parent. There was yelling exchanged between the two for about 3 to 5 minutes. Eventually, the home team parents left the area together, while the away team parents remained grouped in the back of the field. An away team parent approached me and insisted that I needed to address the situation with the home team. To gain clarity about what happened, I spoke with the away team coach. He informed me that the home team parent had made threats to fight one of his parents.

- This game was canceled due to poor AQI.
- Game cancelled for smoke

- Game cancelled due to Weather / Air Quality
- Game canceled due to smoke.
- game cancelled last minute due to smoke
- · game cancelled last minute due to smoke
- Both coaches were not friendly to me as the ref compared to the other games I did.
- Yellow to number 12 of home team, Blocked a goal with hand
- Argumentative parents were excused from the game for dissent, not clear what they said I
  was on the coaches side however the game was stopped for about 3 mins.
- Home team arrived at 11:20
- Coach from home team got a y card for dissent in minute 55. He yelled to my line man very loud "no! that is no offside." I told him no more yelling. 5 minutes later, he was still very upset about my call and said: "what hell was that call."

The coach from home team kept yelling at me based on my offside call. The other coach was telling him it was the correct call. Center ref gave him a yellow because he would not stop.

- Home team coaches were being rude and I talked to them after the game about being nicer to the referees.
- Red cards were issued for behavior but I was on the opposite side of the field so I couldn't here what happened.

The yellow cards were issued to home team #1, #12, #14, the coach, #1 again, #2, and #4. The red cards were issued to home team coach, #1, and #23.

We had two issues that need to be addressed from this match this afternoon:

- 1.The coach for home team was sent off for a second caution for dissent. Unfortunately he made quite a scene with his referee abuse, very vocal stating "terrible calls and the worst he has seen" over and over in a loud manner as he was making his way off the pitch. Unfortunate for the kids to see that happen.
- 2. At 3 minutes post match, as my crew was getting set to leave, a member of the home team came to pick up the team gear and was very vocal/abusive towards the center referee.

- Away team Player #43 fell after a shoulder-to-shoulder collision on the 40-yard line in front
  of the coaches and injured his shoulder when he fell to the ground. He had to be taken to
  the emergency room. I'm letting you know why he got hurt.
- During 2nd half 60min past time. Home team player #24 had yellow card from me being misconduct action.
- No weights on soccer goals
- The visiting team didn't have roster.
- Yellow shown to away team number 33
- After the match ended and the referees had walked off the field, they stood at the half to conduct a post-game discussion. A family member from the visiting team, approached in a confrontational manner. The female family member was asking for the referees' names and taking pictures aggressively with her phone. When she asked for the referees' names, we inquired as to the reason. The family member said to "file a complaint." We declined to give our names to the person, but she continued, recording us, saying, "This is no-name referee and this is 'no-name referee" etc while the phone/camera was pointed at the crew. The referees attempted to ignore her, and she walked away muttering in Spanish to other family members, leaving their garbage and donut boxes in the stands. The referees felt a little unsafe with this person acting negatively and thus quickly left the field towards our cars.
- After the game, a player on the home team reported that a player on the away team had said
  "fuck you" to him after a stoppage in play for a foul. No action was taken, as it wasn't heard
  by the officials. However, the home coach confirmed that his player had reported the same
  to him, and that he, the coach, had attempted to speak with the away coach about the
  matter, only to be dismissed.
- At the end of the game, coach for the away team, reported that player #10 from the home team used the word 'N\*\*\*er' in reference to the whole away team. Actual statement was 'you n\*\*\*\*rs suck!".
- Home team head coach took steps to slow down the scoring in the second half
- There was no sandbags and there was a hole in the goal that we had to cover up with coaches bag for every game
- excessive abuse from home team coach issued yellow card
- The coaches started arguing in the second half, home team's coaches specifically were saying disrespectful things to the away teams coach. Towards the end of the game, away

teams coach and the team manager reported to me that there were two #11s on the field (which I counted and confirmed) and two #10s (I did not see this myself). They also said players were swapping jerseys. The arguing seemed fairly typical, but I was concerned regarding whether everyone playing was on the game report.

- Parent of home team cussing at center referee got sent off.
- Parents were screaming at me during the first half complaining multiple calls and been directed to the center referee. I stoped the play and talked to both coaches and aske them to tak to their parents. After that, things calm down and there was not more screaming.
- The yellow card was issued to away team #97.
- I had to stop the game for a few minutes in the second half after a home team player was driving the ball in their offensive half and lost it after a clean tackle by the other team. The home team parents erupted from the sideline, with one gentleman screaming â?? What the hell, ref! That was a foul!â??, followed by the home parents exchanging words with the opposing players that were on the field. I instructed the home coach to take care of the issue and he was able to eventually get them to calm down. I resumed the game and didnâ?? thave to stop it again.
- away team was a no-show. Home team was there and ready to play.
- Coaches on both teams initially informed me they do not have player cards. When I clarified, plastic cards or digital, they both showed me digital card list. They could not show me player pictures on their mobiles. On inquiry they both responded 'manager has uploaded pictures' and that OYSA has to finalise. I accepted their response as made in good-faith.
- Red card to a Assistant coach of the away team. I give to him a yellow card for arguing every call I made after (six consecutive calls including across from the field) after which he responded to me I don't care that you give me yellow card [I'll keep doing it] while laughing so I have him a straight red card for using offensive, insulting/ abusive language and actions. After receiving the red card the coach was initially confused by the red card and initially did not want to leave but finally obliged while yelling he would report me and took pictures of me on his phone while slowly leaving the field.

  - During the match, player number 80, of the home team, used inappropriate language while on the bench.

The appropriate disciplinary action was taken in accordance with the regulations. Yellow Card

- Not a bad thing but coach from home team elected to pay a player down after the 18th minute due to being up 3-0. elected to play down 2 players in the 55th minute after going up 5-0. tTe coach elected to do this, it was not requested by me or my Ar's.
- We had to talk to home teams coach for yelling at us referees.
- A home team Fan Was yelling constantly throughout about what they though were fouls
- Yellow card #1 was for repeated fouls by the player, yellow #2 was for dissent
- A player made racial remark. The sprinklers turned on during the 2nd half.
- Home Team player complain that two of the away team's players were passing racist comments on players and referee. I did not hear anything myself.
- Spectators (about 10) had setup their chairs between fields 5 and 6 from before 10am. They
  were requested to move between fields 5 and 4 with help of home team, Coach. There were
  no situations related to the change. Several spectators (about 12-14) were behind the
  walking path behind the goal-line and this was acceptable location as they were clearly not
  interfering with on-field play; that location was the only one that offered natural shade from
  trees.
- The home team didn't have a printed roster nor digital so I used the roster from the visiting team.
- In the 45th minute I called the captains to the center mark as a goal had just been scored. I was hearing banter between the teams and was starting to rise in the level of Intensity. I spoke with the captains and stated if I heard any one else talking / mocking the other team that I would card them for verbal taunting or derogatory comments. This actions stopped all of the chatter between the two teams and no further incidents occurred. This was done out of a caution to not let it get out of hand.
- AR1 got hurt about 10 minutes into the game He tried to resume He could not.
- The coach from the away team was being very talkative and failed to demonstrate good behavior. He did not respect the call, and kept arguing to me, AR1 and the center official. In return, the referee issued him a yellow and then a red card for his exchange, and the coach was still very slow to leave the game.
- The away team coaches regularly asked me to call the five second rule for goal kicks.

- The coach on the away team kept yelling at the center and the ar on his side. After he got a red card he continued to yell at the center.
- In this game there were multiple altercations with players, ie. punching, hitting, and using a corner flag as a weapon towards other players per the center ref. This took place during the second half with about 10 minutes remaining near corner of where the AR1 was standing. As the AR2 on the opposite side of the field I didn't get a good view of what happened but the center ref filled me in during our post game meeting. He added that a couple of players were bleeding due to the fight, two of which were red carded and removed from the game. We were informed by players from both teams at the end of the game who wanted to talk to us that there was a lot of foul language like use of the N word, the F word, the MF word, and other insults.

There were 2 red cards and one yellow card issued during this game. There was an intense physical fight started between two players that quickly involved others, where players were tackling, pushing and attempting to punch one another, resulting in the center ref and myself agreeing 2 red cards needed to be issued to both players that initiated the fight. During the game there was also a controversial call of offside resulting in calling back the white team's goal. Shortly after this call I heard the coach of the white team ( the team that had the goal called off ) shout multiple things directed at me and my center referee. I heard him say something along the lines "She doesn't know what she's doing, she doesn't understand the rules!" At the time I also heard profanity, though I'm unsure if it was a player or coach who said it, "what the F\* was that call or why the F\* did they call that!?" There was also parental verbal abuse throughout the entirety of the game, as calls were or were not in favor of teams, we received and heard many comments. Some like, "Get him off the field, he doesn't know what he's doing!" and "take control of your game" and "That better be a yellow/red, why is nobody calling these!" And more. I also had an interference with the white teams coach, after the center ref and I had called a foul on one of their teams players giving the other team a direct free kick, where the coach had said directly to me, "what are you doing ref, you have called every single foul against us and never them!" To which I responded, "we're doing our best, I'm sorry."

- Multiple situations where the home team coach was getting frustrated before i had the chance to make a call. One parent kept yelling goalie was out of the box and I had to explain that the first box is not the box its the 6
- In the second half the coach of the home team was given a yellow card for arguing and talking back to the referee after being shown a yellow card, referee showed the coach a red and asked him to leave
- Visiting coaches were warned in the first half for complaints about calls made by me along
  with the 14 year old AR. I took a goal off the board early because of a charge by their player
  to get the defender away from the ball. A second goal was taken off by the AR for offside as
  he waited for the player to play the ball before putting the flag up. The coaches made
  comments of "Don't worry "player name" you weren't offside. Undermining the AR in a non

direct way. At this point I told them I don't want to hear any more from the sideline about calls. Twenty minutes into the second half the coach was unhappy with another call and yelled out that "just because a player falls over doesn't mean it's a foul". I walked over and showed him a yellow card. He tried to argue saying "I was telling my team that it's not always a foul and they should keep playing for the ball". These coaches should be reminded that complaints on a minor referee can result in a lot more trouble and passive aggressive comments of yelling at your players about how you weren't offside or that wasn't a foul is still dissent.

- Coaches from the away team were very disrespectful as well as the parents
- Game cancelled due to smoke
- The away team head coach was not respecting my calls. Yelling loudly and contesting virtually every call against his team. I warned him, he continued to complain, then I warned him again that he would be receiving a yellow and he said go ahead and give me a yellow. So I gave him the yellow. But then the assistant coach started to take over the onslaught of complaints even when the call was in his teams favor. Just a lot of complaining about uncalled handballs mostly and a couple of fouls he thought that I missed.
- Head Coach of away team was yelling disrespectfully however sincerely apologized and was extremely respectful to all players, coaches, and refs after. He still did receive a yellow after an outburst, but was civilized otherwise.
  - Gave yellow card to away team coach for disagreeing with me about the calls I was making and yelling at me loudly about it.
- The game was suspended in the 45 minute due to poor air quality. See the center report for complete details.
  - game abandoned in the 45th minute due to air quality being at 142
- Coach of away team got mad that I didnâ? call an offside and started yelling at me and at half time he came up the us yelling until center gave him a yellow.
- #14 of home team left in the first half with a knee injury and did not return
- away team coach was very frustrated because of the size difference between his players and the other team. Pacific in no way played overly physical or out of control. However, when fouls were called he still complained loudly about how i needed to card someone, just because one of his players hit their knee and needed to come off. There was no persistent infringement by any player or on any player. Just bad luck one of his injuries happened when his girl fell over the ball and tripped an opponent, causing her to fall on top. He even commented at half time, 'that he liked how i was keeping the game clean.' Maybe not his best day, but if their is a pattern i wanted this to be noted. Luke

- His yellows were for the players being too physical after repeated warnings
- Red card issued at the 24th min to the Away GK, see report for details.
- At full time, the away coach told me that his player was called a fucking c\*nt by home team player 19. I did not hear it but, I had both players shake hands and both coaches were informed about the situation.
- At the end of the game, an spectator from visiting team, was waiting for at the gate between
  the field and the parking lot, and he screamed on me: "YOU NEED TO PROTECT THE
  GOALKEEPER, MAN". I did not engage and continued walking towards my car, because the
  spectator looked like he was looking for confrontation. No further issues happened.
- I did not hear the comments made but the Center ref had to call over away team's coach to tell the parents near AR2 to be quiet.
  - away fans were verbally upset by some calls and mocked the refs which the center eventually addressed with the coach and fans on the sideline
- Durante la la primera parte del juego todo se encontraba con normalidad, hasta aproximadamente el minuto 30 cuando alcanzÃ<sup>3</sup> a escuchar algunos padres de familia del equipo home reclamando algunas marcaciones que realice diciendo (Ã;rbitro no viste la falta estas ciego o queâ🏿 sácale tarjeta a ese jugador esta jugando cochino, además de árbitro para eso me gustabas p⤦ árbitro ciego) por lo que tomé la decisión de hablar con el entrenador del home y solicitarle que platicara con los padres y bajar el clima del juego esto aproximadamente al minuto 33 de juego y comentarle que si ocurrÃ-a de nuevo detendrÃ-a el juego, se finalizÃ<sup>3</sup> la primera parte cuando la mamÃ; de uno de los jugadores se cruzÃ<sup>3</sup> hasta el lado donde me encontraba para seguir reclamando a lo cual le dije que ella no deberÃ-a estar allÃ- por favor retÃ-rese me contestÃ<sup>3</sup> (pues entonces mÃ;rca bien que para eso se te estÃ; pagando) por lo que hablé con ambos entrenadores indicÃ;ndoles lo sucedido y que tomaba la desicion de detener el juego viendo que los  $ilde{\mathsf{A}}$ ; nimos segu $ilde{\mathsf{A}}$ -an incrementando de nivel y esto pod $ilde{\mathsf{A}}$ -a transmitirse al terreno de juego y por seguridad de mi equipo de arbitraje en cual se encontraban dos menores de edad y también por la seguridad de los propios jugadores lo detuve a lo que ambos entrenadores estuvieron de acuerdo. Cabe resaltar que el juego se encontraba sin amonestaciones pues ambos equipos se estaban dedicando a hacer su juego, sin mayores incidencias entre ellos y tampoco hubieron protestas de los entrenadores cabe mencionar que los que estaban haciendo incrementar el clima del juego eran los padres de familia. During the first half of the game everything was normal until approximately the 30 minute mark when I heard some parents of the home team complaining about some of the markings I made saying (referee didn't you see the foul are you blind or what... give that player a card he's playing dirty, besides referee that's why I liked you... blind referee) so I

made the decision to talk to the home coach and ask him to talk to the parents and lower the atmosphere of the game this approximately at minute 33 of the game and tell him that if it happened again I would stop the game, the first half ended when the mother of one of the players crossed to the side where I was to continue complaining to which I told her that she shouldn't be There please withdraw he replied (well then mark well that is what you are being paid for) so I spoke with both coaches indicating what had happened and that I made the decision to stop the game seeing that the spirits continued to rise in level and this could be transmitted to the field of play and for the safety of my refereeing team in which there were two minors and also for the safety of the players themselves I stopped it to which both coaches agreed. It is worth noting that the game was without warnings because both teams were dedicating themselves to playing their game, without major incidents between them and there were no protests from the coaches it is worth mentioning that those who were increasing the atmosphere of the game were the parents.

Parents were being harrasing/ complaining at the center official a lot, game was called and ended at halftime

Parents were being rude to officials, they were cussing at the official. The ref ask the coach to talk to them, he did a they kept going. One of the moms came up to the official at half and started talking to to ref and the ref ended the game.

I stopped the game due to the constant claims of the parents of the home club, during the first half they were claiming some game actions so I asked the coach to talk to them and however during half time I was approached by a lady mother of one of the players who crossed the field to continue with the claims so I decided not to continue with the game to prevent the heat of the game from escalating she told me (to do my job well that's what they pay me for) so I talked to both coaches and ended the match for the safety of my refereeing team

- Home team #41 yellow card for a foul
- Yellow 14 home team UB got into a pushing match with 4 from away team
   Yellow 16 away team PO persistent fouls, given warning and later yellow
   Yellow 4 away team UB got into a pushing match with 14 from home team
- Keeper came out with a head injury
- After the final whistle, the head coach from away team approached me to discuss the game, particularly the point in the game where I awarded a goal kick to home team rather than a goal to the other team (the context leading up to this discussion is in my misconduct report... the original context ultimately resulted in a yellow card for one of the assistant coaches for away team). He was upset and said that decision, "Took momentum away from my boys and that's just not fair.". I acknowledged his frustration and said, "Coach, I understand. But I hope you can understand I'm trying to do my best with the information I have available. Again, as a referee I'm not going to change my decision because a coach or

spectator is yelling at me that I got the call wrong." He got increasingly agitated, and continued to express his displeasure. At this point, his assistant coaches came over to join in the conversation. Not wanting to make the situation bigger, I told the head coach, "Coach, it is clear there is nothing I can say that is going to change the situation, so I am going to have to ask you to leave." He responded with, "I don't have to leave anywhere! This is America, and I'll go wherever I god-damn please. I'll stay here as long as I want." I went back to my stuff and began to debrief with my referee crew. At that point, the assistant coach I yellow carded earlier in the match came over and began filming me and my crew with his phone. Then, while filming, he asked what my name was. He did this multiple times and did not leave. At this point I went to one of the coaches from the home team and explained that the other team is not leaving and the coaches are harassing the referees. They said they would go deal with the coaches. I grabbed my stuff, walked to my vehicle, and left.

Coaches were very hostile in the game towards the center ref. The coach may have used racial saying to the referee crew. Other coaches had to get involve to ask the away coach to leave.

There was a call towards the end of the game that involved a potential goal. After the call was decided, the coach of the team whoâ less goal was overturned disputed the call aggressively and took pictures of us refs after the game.

- Number 20 on home team was arguing with me and fouling others after I gave him warnings.
- In todayâ respectful and very critical In how me and the refs preformed today it made it really hard to ref when we were being talked down to and told we were not doing good.
- Player refused to take out earings before game, called referee assignor to double check that you still cannot tape at 12U SCL. assignor confirmed, parent yelled at me and gave me a hard time before game. Diffused situation by telling about why itâ<sup>22</sup>s a real rule and itâ<sup>22</sup>s a safety hazard. Parent gave up and player took out her earrings. No further conflict.
- 2 yellows 1 from each team
- The home team fans were distracting the Visiting goalkeeper from behind and to the side of the goal on the west side nearest the parking. I stopped the game and asked the fans to move, which they did.
- game canceled from aqi
